Dear Friends:

One of the distinctive features of our Presbyterian tradition is the important contribution that Presbyterians made during the forming of our country. For example, there was only one clergyperson who signed the Declaration of Independence, John Witherspoon. Rev. Witherspoon was the President of Princeton and a Presbyterian Clergy person. During the Revolutionary War, King George called the conflict, "a Presbyterian Rebellion".

As people of faith and Presbyterians, part of our DNA is the realization that we are called to live out our lives and our faith in the world that is in need of healing. In the Confession of 1967, the vital nature of our engagement is shared:

Wherever the church exists, its members are both gathered in corporate life and dispersed in society for the sake of mission in the world.

The church gathers to praise God, to hear God's word for humankind, to baptize and to join in the Lord's Supper, to pray for and present the world to God in worship, to enjoy fellowship, to receive instruction, strength, and comfort, to order and organize its own corporate life, to be tested, renewed, and reformed, and to speak and act in the world's affairs as may be appropriate to the needs of the time.

The church disperses to serve God wherever its members are, at work or play, in private or in the life of society. Their prayer and Bible study are part of the church's worship and theological reflection. Their witness is the church's evangelism. Their daily action in the world is the church in mission to the world. The quality of their relation with other persons is the measure of the church's fidelity.

What does it mean to be Presbyterian in 2022? What is our witness?
